

## Petrol stations join fight against fly-tippers

A CAMPAIGN to deter drivers from fly-tipping has been launched at petrol stations across Nottinghamshire.

Adverts will be displayed on petrol pump nozzles at 78 garages around the county, which also provide a telephone number for people to report fly-tippers.

The campaign which runs until the end of the month and has been funded by the Nottinghamshire Partnership and the Environment Agency is part of Operation Maid Marian, a two-year initiative to catch local fly-tippers.

Coun Chris Baron, cabinet member for environment and sustainability, said: "The county council, through the Nottinghamshire Partnership, is working very hard to catch fly-tippers or, better still, to deter them from dumping rubbish in the first place.

"This campaign is targeted at people who might be considering using their car or van to dump rubbish and also drivers who might spot others acting suspiciously."
